outcome and evaluation
The school tours successfully demystify complex architectural concepts by translating them into an accessible and engaging format for students. Through interactive methods, including crosswords, architectural puzzles, and hands-on model making, participants move from passive observation to active creation. The program promotes local heritage and key figures; for instance, students explored the legacy of Stanisława and Maciej Nowiccy and discovered the vital yet often overlooked role of women in shaping Warsaw's urban landscape. Furthermore, the "A Day Without a Calendar" project expanded the educational setting into the city streets, teaching students the art of architectural photography during guided walks.

Our project is a series of integrated educational sessions that blend the format of guided tours with immersive workshops. Each session is designed to transform theoretical architectural knowledge into practical experience through specific creative tasks. By combining Zodiak visits and city walks with activities like model building, architectural photography, and analytical puzzles, we move beyond passive observation. This formula allows students to actively engage with themes ranging from modernist legacy to the role of women in urban planning. It is a holistic approach where the exhibition serves as a starting point for hands-on creation, helping young participants to "read" and shape their own urban environment.
